ALL: Good afternoon, Gerdean. It was very gracious of you to volunteer to tell us about yourself.

Gerdean: You are too kind. ALL needed someone to interview and I happened to be conveniently located! And you *know* how I love to jabber!

ALL: Well, you know the format. Jump in and give us a little background on yourself.

Gerdean: Well, without writing my life's story, I was born on 11/11/44 and raised in rural Pennsylvania. My parents are both deceased, as is my kid brother Joe. But my sister Shawnie, an RN, lives here in New Mexico.

ALL: I know you well enough to know you have had an interesting life. Have you ever considered writing your memoirs?

Gerdean: I've thought about it. But I fail to see what purpose it would serve. Who cares, really, when all is said and done?

ALL: I can't speak for others, but I would *love* to read your memoirs! You have a unique perspective and it might be quite revealing for folks to get to know you.

Gerdean: I tend to reveal too much as it is. I often tell people more than they want to hear because I am such an open book. I make people nervous by being so outspoken.

ALL: Where were you educated?

Gerdean: I graduated from Warren G. Harding Sr. High School in Warren, Ohio, in 1962. Later, in California, I was encouraged to attend Cal State Long Beach, where I majored in English with a minor in Drama, until I became a full-time hippie drop-out (also quite an education!). In 1968 I moved to Hawaii where I found the Urantia Book, which provided me with a *real* education. I have also taken night courses at sundry schools, but I do not have a degree.

ALL: Let me ask you about employment. What did you do in your mortal career?

Gerdean: In my youth I did all sorts of unskilled labor, minimum-wage type work, mostly desk work. But when I was 36, I was hired by Frank H. Allen, Jr., as his secretary at a major civil law firm. I was not a very good legal secretary, but when he was appointed District Judge, I went with him as his Judicial Secretary and there I found my professional niche.

ALL: How so?

Gerdean: (Laughing) I was able to tell lawyers what to do instead of them telling me what to do, which I loved! But that was not the only reason. Judge Allen was a truly great man. Everybody respected him. He was voted the top jurist in the District for ten years running. It was an honor to work for such a man. I was compelled to excel. And he gave me *carte blanche* authority over my desk. He trusted my work without hanging over my shoulder to check up on me. His faith in me encouraged me to be more than I might have been otherwise.

It was a position of authority and prestige. I managed the Judge's calendar, scheduled his trials and hearings. Plus it was a service position -- to serve the Judge, the Division, and the State of New Mexico – and as an arm of the Court, I also served the press, the litigants, and the jurors. It was a very exciting and rewarding career.

With my interests in spiritual sociology and civilization, what I was able to gain behind the scenes, in terms of victims, perpetrators, frauds, dysfunction, etc., gave me more insight into the human condition than I could have gotten from college studies.

ALL: Why did you leave?

Gerdean: For the last five years I was with the Judge, he was the Grand Jury Judge and Presiding Judge of the Criminal Division, which put us knee deep into the criminal element. When my own home was broken into, I began to think there were no decent people left in the world. I started to become cynical and feel hopeless. I was lonely, drinking too much, and working too hard. I had to make some changes, somehow. In 1991 I got involved in both AA and the Teaching Mission. "Welcome to Change!" Two years later I found a Judicial Secretary to replace me and I bailed out. ALL: What did you do? Where did you go? How did you live?

Gerdean: I sold my house and moved to Pocatello where I worked as a UCC Church secretary. After two years I moved back east and opened "Serendipity!" a used book store, which I operated for the four years I was there. As much as I loved working for the Judge, I loved working for myself even more. After I met Angus, we returned to the Great Southwest, and I returned to the legal field, from which I retired in 2006.

ALL: One of the questions I like to ask is "What was your religious background?"

Gerdean: I really didn't have any. I was not raised with religious convictions. My mom became a Jehovah's Witnesses and took a perverse delight in disassociating herself from Christianity. Through their ministry school, I learned scripture and went proselytizing from door-to-door, but I never could relate to Jehovah. God was off in heaven somewhere and Jesus never visited our house. I don't remember our family ever saying prayers.

I might not have had any sense of religiosity at all but for the hymns my Grandmother sang as we walked to and from the mailbox, half a mile away. My personal religion was wrapped up in my invisible friends "Shoe and Sock" from the time I was four or five years old. It was very easy then for me to embrace the Teacher Corps because I was already quite impressed by invisible helpers.

ALL: What about the UB?

Gerdean: Well, when I left the Witnesses, at 14, I searched for ten years for something to believe in. When I was 24, the UB found me in a village on the North Shore of Oahu, Hawaii. An old hippie friend introduced me to the book and to my neighbor, Alan Smith, whom I eventually married.

ALL: Are you married now? Any kids?

Gerdean: I *am* married to a wonderful man. Many of you know Angus. He is a prince. We are very compatible and have made "intelligent wedlock" an actuality.



In fact, Angus is on the ALL Council. He was interviewed by ALL a couple of months ago, and his UB story is in HIFTUB.

The UB and celestial correspondence have been things I have enjoyed in both of my marriages, but Angus is much easier to get along with than Alan was. No kids.

ALL: I can see where telling your life story could get extensive, and I would love to hear more, but ALL is an organization that likes to shine the light on service work, so let's focus on that.

Gerdean: Okay, but you know, this is a bit awkward. Being interviewed by a serviceoriented organization could be seen to be a very self-serving endeavor. It does not seem very humble to sit around and say, "Oh, I've done this and I've done that, and I plan to whatever." **Gerdean:** Very well. Let's see. On my wall I have a plaque from the Second Judicial District Court of the State of New Mexico, an Award of Appreciation "In sincere and grateful appreciation of the exceptionally dedicated effort, invaluable service, and unstinted devotion to the betterment of the Judiciary."

I have a certificate that was issued to me and Angus "For Outstanding Achievements in Brotherly Love in Action to family, friends, and strangers." It was presented to us by the Brotherly Love in Action Committee, signed by Gerry Baker and Sue Allbritton. We all should have such a plaque.

ALL: Funny how we put such stock in what we can put our hands on, even though service is said to be done when the left hand doesn't know what the right hand is doing.

Gerdean: It's easier to say "I got a plaque" than to enumerate the things we did to be of service, as if we are gaining points somehow by serving others. The truth is, usually when we serve others we are also serving ourselves. It feels good to do good to others. Whether they know we are doing it or not, we know it, so there is a payback; there is a reward for being of service.

ALL: Let's move on to those service areas where you don't have a plaque on the wall or a product to show for it. What about those areas? You helped create ALL, didn't you?

Gerdean: I helped pull the Constitution together, yes. It took about six months. At the 2003 Stella Niagara TeaM Conference the idea was planted to create an umbrella organization that would support the personal service projects of those who had been inspired by the Urantia Book and/or the

ALL: Humor me.

Teaching Mission -- to write books, make music, create organizations or websites to further the cause of truth, beauty and goodness – and it grew from there.

The Constitutional Committee, led by Bobby Devine, included Allene Vick, Eugenia Bryan, Judy Langston, and myself. Except for a couple of loopholes that were left open on purpose to permit expansion, it was a tight knit document that enabled us to launch on January 1, 2004.

The terms of service were staggered so that, in time, everybody would serve three year terms. I volunteered for partial term of two years, and after that I stepped down for somebody else to have a turn.

I served then as a Liaison between the Council and the Membership and also produced a few issues of the newsletter. Now I'm back doing the newsletter again. There's a lot that could be done with this publication. We haven't begun to scratch the surface of its potential.

ALL: We'll take that up in another column, maybe another issue. But tell us about "The Zooid Mission." How did you intend to serve through the writing of that book? Or was that simply to get rich and famous?

Gerdean: I intended to encourage the idea of creating a new government, new politics if you will, a new civilization inspired by the UB, most notably Paper 72, Government on a Neighboring Planet. Figuratively speaking, it's probably the biggest plaque on my wall -- the most overt and concrete representation of what I consider to be my real service to Urantia. I consider it a tribute to teamwork, to community effort. **Gerdean:** I would, too! But it might never get written. TZM was a huge undertaking, a monumental accomplishment. Most folks have no clue what goes into writing a book. It's not as easy as we might like to think. I have since enjoyed helping other aspiring young writers get their books published. I am skilled at editing, so I like to use that skill to help others – at a ridiculously low rate, and often for free.

I have edited a couple of Jim Cleveland's books; a couple of George Barnard's books; Mary Livingston's book, UB Basics; a selection of Teacher Welmek's T/R'd "Lessons on Prayer" for Donna D'Ingillo's book; and JOYce Mary Brenton's daily meditation book, "The Mind of Christ – Yesterday, Today and Forever" – which is planning another printing, by the way!

I put together a presentation of Jim Young's poetry on Theresa Logan's beautiful floral pictures, entitled "Unshadowland." Angus and I edited Teacher Tomas's lessons on "Fruits of the Spirit" that the Harp of God published. We were founding members of Harp. Recently I supplied the material for the Teaching Mission page of Harp's new website at <u>www.harpofgod.org</u>.

I facilitated two TeaM retreats here in New Mexico at the Canossian Spirituality Center. I produce the ALL Newsletter monthly. I do Light Line every so often. I've served on the board of <u>www.lightandlife.com</u> and am helping Jim edit the new TeaM book he is producing. I have accommodated Ron Besser's <u>www.tmarchives.com</u> as well as Rob Davis' efforts at <u>www.daynal.com</u>. I keep busy.

ALL: Here's an outside question for you. Where did you learn to do a newsletter?

ALL: I'd like to read the sequel.

Gerdean: Hmmm. It seems like I have been doing newsletters since I was a kid. When I worked for Dodi's Department Store in Honolulu, I was in charge of their twice weekly, full page, newspaper ads for major appliances, and that got me started on "cut and paste" with attention to detail. At the Courthouse, I was asked to be the Editor of the Courthouse Gazette, which was devised to stir up communications between the various Divisions. I consider newsletters to be artsy-craftsy, rather like scrapbooking.

ALL: What are you working on now?

Gerdean: Right now I am working on a book about the Seven Chakra Vortices and the Seven Adjutant Mind-Spirits, hoping to enter it in the New Mexico 2010 Book Awards. It sets forth the theory that the Chakras and the Adjutants are one in the same thing. It compares and integrates the two energy circuit systems. In any case, the work will hopefully serve to introduce New Age people to the Urantia Books' teachings.

ALL: Tell us about your service as a T/R. Is that not your most obvious service?

Gerdean: I really don't understand what T/Ring is, so I am not sure if it is a service or a disservice. The jury is still out on that.

ALL: That is an astonishing thing to say, particularly in view of the fact that there are many people who laud your work. You have produced a huge body of transcripts!

Gerdean: The UB says "Life is not real to one who cannot do some one thing well, expertly." And I think T/R'ing is the one thing I have done well, but I have never considered it to be "mine" – not like my writing, or my painting. So while I derived great pleasure from it, the persecutions from debunkers and the stewardship issues were unbelievably difficult for me. Of course, I still care what the transcripts look like and how they read, but the less attention I pay to how they are used when they leave my desk, the better off we all are. I can't afford to take them personally.

In the final analysis, I suspect I will have served in ways I was totally unaware of, and what I thought was my best service, was in fact trivia. The first shall be last and the last shall be first. We can't judge. We can only act; the consequences are God's.

ALL: I forgot to ask you about your art.

Gerdean: I enjoy painting. I started doing oil paintings in 1983, so I have been at it 27 years now. Of course, you get better as you practice, and I don't paint as much as I used to, but I'm still doing okay. You can see my work at Miss O'Dell's Studio, which is the last page on the <u>http://www.odellbowen.com</u> site. Or just Google: Miss O'Dell's Studio. It'll take you right to it. It isn't current, and it isn't complete, but it gives you an idea.

ALL: Now is a good time to ask you: What have I neglected to ask you about that you would like to tell me?

Gerdean: I think my greatest service is not in what I do but in who I am, and withal, to reveal myself as openly as possible, to be as transparent and as vulnerable as I dare. By baring my soul as I do, and by exposing my feelings -- my human failings and my flaws -- I do subject myself to derision and disrespect, but I also reveal myself as a woman without guile. I accept myself and I love myself, even with my imperfections, which means that I can also love other people "warts and all."

We are not saints; we are human, and we are only human once, so I am not going to

waste my life trying to be somebody I'm not. Or trying to master things that I simply cannot grasp, like creating a website.

ALL: Well, I know what you mean about computers. I'm not very good with technology either.

Alas, our time has come to an end, Gerdean. I want to thank you for taking the time to sit and chat with us. And best wishes on all your efforts and undertakings.

Gerdean: Thank you for having me. It's been my pleasure.
